Tanzania walks talk in fishing agenda

Mtwara Regional Commissioner Gelasius Byakawa said yesterday that the pledge to improve fishing industry in the next five years will lead to increased economic gains from the sector.

"Our government is fully committed to improve the economic condition of our fishermen and other people engaged in the fishery sector. This will be done in the next five years by ensuring that we create a conducive climate for fishing," he said.

Mr Byakawa made the remarks when officiating at celebrations to mark World Fisheries Day organised in Mtwara at the national level. The event was organised by Tanzania Tuna Fishery National Alliance to create awareness on sustainable fishing in the country.

The Regional Commissioner's statement comes just a week after Minister for Foreign Affairs and East African Cooperation Prof Palamagamba Kabudi underlined his ministry's priorities of which, the blue economy tops the agenda.

In a speech read on his behalf by Mtwara District Commissioner Dastan Kyobya, Mr Byakawa said the sector will improve through the transfer of technology use, providing support services as well as training of the small-scale fish farmers and fishermen.

The improvement plan once implemented will lead to an increase of fish production and in turn help increase government's revenue in exporting fish and fish products.

Mr Byakawa also mentioned the creation of employment opportunities for youth and improving the socio-economic

conditions of coastal fishing communities, mostly in Mtwara.

He appealed to the private sector – including TUNA Alliance – to team up with the government regarding the planning, construction and management of the fishing harbour set to be built in Mtwara.

He said the private organisations stand a better chance to link with the government in creating and implementing projects that will attract foreign and local investors into investing in the fishery sector.

Mr Byakawa also asked TUNA Alliance to encourage fishermen to use modern fishing tools, improve fishing infrastructure and technology transfer in breeding of fish, nursing and feeding, and harvesting of fish products.

"TUNA Alliance should also encourage their members to be involved in organising groups for income-generating activities with the aim of providing them with fishing knowledge and modern fishing tools," he said.

He also noted that the government has developed suitable infrastructure such as roads, electricity and others for improvement of the fishing environment. Mtwara District Commissioner Dastan Kyobya directed the district fisheries officer to issue licences to fishermen to enable them undertake fishing activities.

The issuance of the licences fishing communities should be conducted in line with inspection of the fishing tools in the area.

Speaking at the event, a representative of fishermen, Mr Abbas Sahari, said artisanal fishermen face challenges such as lack of technical knowledge,

lack of modern fishing equipment and lack of skills in management.

He appealed to the government to provide technical training to fishing communities as well supporting them with modern fishing tools.

A week ago, Minister Kabudi said at the Chamwino State House in Dodoma after taking oath that his ministry will ensure that the country's economy brings the desired socio-economic changes, touching on employment generation, uplifting the business environment and guaranteed supply of raw materials for local industries.

He said the government will also cooperate with such associations as the Indian Ocean Rim Association (IORA), Indian Ocean Tuna Commission (IOTC), and Southwest Indian Ocean Fisheries Commission (SWIOFC) aimed at strengthening regional cooperation and sustainable development within the Indian Ocean region.

The government, Prof Kabudi said, would adhere to the 2020-2025 CCM Election Manifesto, and President John Magufuli's 12th Parliament inaugural speech of November 13, 2020, which had emphasis on the revitalisation of the national economy in the next five years.

In his speech, President Magufuli said that by improving this strategic sector of fishing, the majority Tanzanians will be able to engage in various activities and thus build both individual and national economies.

The Head of State said the government has already laid strategies for improving the fishing industry in deep sea, and that eight fishing vessels will be bought for that purpose.

SWIOFish yaleta matokeo chanya sekta ya uvuvi

■ ■ MRADI wa Usimamizi Shirikishi wa Rasilimali za Uvuvi Kusini Mgharibi mwa Bahari ya Hindi (SWIOFish) kumwepesha matokeo chanya na upo katika mwelekeo mzuu wa utekelezaji hapa ndani.

Hayo yalisesemwa na Katibu Mkuu wa Uvuvi, Wizara ya Mifugo na Uvuvi, Dkt. Rashid Tamatamah wakati wa ufunguaji wa kikao kikazi cha wataalam wa sekta ya uvuvi wa mradi wa SWIOFish na wahani wa vyombo vya habari jiji Dar es Salaam.

Alitaja mafanikio ya mradi huo kuwa ni pamoja na kuweza kudhibiti uvuvi haramu wa kutumia baruti na mabomu ambao umedhibitiwa kwa asilimia 100 kutokana na kumarishwa kwa doni na kuongezeka kwa uelewa wa jami ya Pwani kuhusu madhara ya uvuvi huo.

Dkt. Tamatamah aliongeza kuwa kupita mradi huo usaji wa vyombo vya uvuvi umeongezeka mara dufu hadi kufikia 58 kutoka asilimia 25 ya awali kabla ya mradi.

"Hi imechangiwa na usimamizi wa utekelezaji wa shera na kanuni za uvuvi," alifafanua Dkt. Tamatamah.

Aliongeza kwamba mradi huo umewezesha tafiti mbalimbali ambapo matokeo yake yametumika kurekebisha baadhi ya kanuni za uvuvi ambazo zimesaidia kuongezeka kwa samaki wanamulwa.

"Vile vile tafiti zimeunestha kuongezeka kwa uvuvi wa karibu na wa kutumia ndoano kwa maeneo mengi. Mfano marekebishi ya shera ya uvuvi ya 2009 kuhusu kubadilisha ukubwa wa macho ya nyavu za kuwala daga kwa milimita nane baada ya milimita 10 ambapo kumiongeza tija kwa wivu wa daga," alisesema na kuongeza.

"Katika maeneo ya Pwani baadhi ya samaki wali tuwika wameanza kumekana kwa mfano samaki auu ya Sangani na wengon. Haya ni baadhi ya matokeo ya kumtaka kwa usimamizi wa rasilimali za uvuvi ndani."

Dkt. Tamatamah alid kusema kwamba mradi wa SWIOFish umeweza kufatuli mifanuzi ya

uvuvi endelevu ambayo yamesaidia kuongezeka kwa uelewa wa jami ya Pwani.

"Elimu hiyo imesababisha baadhi ya wavuvi kutekelekeza kwa hani usimamizi wa rasilimali za bahari kwa mfano jami ya uvuvi wa Sangosango-wilayani Kilwa na Ushongo-wilayani Pangani wameamua kufunga shughuli za uvuvi wa pweza na kuvua kwa kipindi maalum kila baada ya miezi mitatu ili kuruhusu samaki hao kukaa ili kuvuliwa katika kwango kinachoruhusiwa na kisheria," alisesema.

Aidha, alisesema elimu hiyo imesaidia ulinzi shirikishi wa rasilimali za bahari.

Kwa upande wa uanzishwaji wa vikundi Dkt. Tamatamah alisesema vimeanzishwa 50 vya usimamizi shirikishi wa rasilimali za uvuvi (Beach Management Unit-BMU) katika wilaya tano za mfano ambavyo vimewezeshwa na mradi huo.

Alid kufafanua kwamba BMU hizo zimeimarisha utunzaji wa mazingira ya Pwani ambapo ukataji misitu ya mikoko umepungua badala yake mikoko imekuwa ikipandwa katika vijiji mbalimbali kwa lengo la kutunza mazingira.

Eneo jingine ambalo mradi huo umeleta matokeo chanya kwa mujibu wa Dkt. Tamatamah ni usafi wa tukwi katika maeneo ya mradi ambapo umeboshwa na uchimbaji mchanga katika tukwi hususan Bagumoyo umepungua kwa kiasi kikubwa.

Alitaja mafanikio mengine ya mradi huo kuwa ni pamoja na kuongezeka kwa mapato yafokanayo na uvuvi hususan maeneo ambako mradi unalekezwa, mfano mapato ya halmashauri ya Wilaya ya Pangani yanwongezeka kutoka sh. milioni 55 mwaka 2016/17 hadi kufikia sh. milioni 235 mwaka 2018/19.

Alisesema kwa kupitia mradi wa SWIOFISH kwango vya daga na mwana vimeandikwa na kupitishwa na Sheka la Vwango la Vwango Tanzania (TBS) na kwamba umehindaji wa vwanjigo hivyo ni bidhaa hizi zoweze kupata mapato ya ubakika ndani na tija ya nchi.
