Gekul gives Ilala director seven-day ultimatum

THE Deputy Minister of Livestock and Fisheries, Ms Pauline Gekul has issued a seven-day ultimatum to Ilala District Executive Director to clear a sum of 5bn/- owed by the contractor of Vingunguti abattoir for completion of the project.

Ms Gekul issued the ultimatum when she went to inspect the development of the project recently in Dar es Salaam.

She said animals are currently being slaughtered in unsafe environment because the condition of most slaughter houses is not encouraging, citing that the Vingunguti abattoir is going to be a savior to the whole country, particularly Dar es Salaam.

"The DED should ensure the money is paid within seven days from (today) Friday for the job to be completed as per President John Magufuli's directive," said Ms Gekul.

She emphasized that completion of the project should go hand in hand with the procurement of special vehicles for supply-

ing meat.

According to her, it will not make sense having a good abattoir while meat is still supplied in the butchers using 'boda bodas'.

She said Pugu auction will undergo major improvement to ensure the abattoir has access to a good and quality animal supply to cater for the demands of consumers.

The Deputy Minister applauded the DED and

contractor for the huge efforts being put in finalizing the project, urging them to speed up the construction.

The Project Supervisor from the National Housing Corporation, Eng Efraim Phanuel pledged to ensure the project is completed by February if the minister's directive is implemented.

Last year when the former Deputy Minister for Livestock and Fisheries, Mr Abdallah Ulega made a

tour of the abattoir, he said the popular slaughter house will serve Dar es residents, neighbouring regions as well as importing meat to neighbouring countries.

"Completion of this facility will increase meat supply and sell outside the country, including in Arab nations," Mr Ulega said.

Among other factors, the slaughterhouse is strategically positioned since it is located near the Julius Nyerere International Airport (JNIA), which makes it easy to transport the meat.

Mr Ulega encouraged local investors with capital to invest in cold storage facilities at the new abattoir, saying it will be another opportunity for investors.

The new facility will have a capacity to slaughter 1500 cows and 1000 goats every day.

The country has been spending over 10bn/- on importing meat, but the deputy minister expressed hopes that the construction of the new abattoir will completely end importation of meat.

This is despite the fact that Tanzania has a high population of cows and goats, totalling 35 million and 20 million, respectively.

Halmashauri zashauriwa kutumia BMU kukusanya mapato ya uvuvi

KAZI kubwa ya Serikali ya Awa-mu ya Tano ni kujenga mazingira bora yatakayowafanya wananchi wake waweze kujizalishia kipato lakini pia kuongeza pato la taifa kwa kulipa kodi.

Kutokana na mazingira hayo, Serikali imeamua kuzihamasisha Halmashauri kwa kuzipa kupitia wananchi husika kukusanya mapato ili kuziwezesha kupata kipato cha uhakika cha kuendesha shughuli zao za kulinda rasilimali.

Hivi karibuni Mratibu wa Mradi wa Usimamizi wa Rasilimali za Bahari Kusini Magharibi mwa Bahari ya Hindi (SWIOFish), Dk. Nicholas Mlalila aliziomba Halmashauri vikuitambua Vikundi vya Ulinzi Shirikishi wa Rasilimali za Uvuvi (BMU).

Lakini pia kuzipa uwezo wa kukusanya mapato yatokanayo na shughuli za uvuvi ili ziweze kusaidia vikundi hivyo kujitendelea na kuendelea sekta ya uvuvi nchini.

Dkt. Mlalila anasema anatambua kuwa kuna changamoto ya kisheria ambayo baadhi ya Halmashauri zimetumia kuziuzia BMU kukusanya

mapato yanayotokana na rasilimali za uvuvi.

"Tunahamasisha Halmashauri kuwapa uwezo BMU kukusanya mapato ili kuziwezesha kupata kipato cha uhakika cha kuendesha shughuli zao za kulinda rasilimali za Uvuvi lakini pia mapato hayo yatawezesha kuendelea sekta ya uvuvi tofauti na ilivyo sasa,"anasema Dk. Mlalila.

Katika baadhi ya Halmashauri ambazo wame-wapa kazi BMU ya kukusanya mapato kama vile Halmashauri ya Wilaya ya Pangani, Mkoani Tanga, Mapato yanayotokana na uvuvi yameongezeka kutoka shilingi milioni 9 kwa robo mwaka hadi milioni 51 na kutoka shilingi milioni 36 hadi milioni 256 kwa mwaka.

"Nazishauri Halmashauri nyingine zichukue mfano wa Halmashauri ya Wilaya ya Pangani kwa sababu sisi tumezipa mafunzo ya kina hizi BMU katika kusimamia fedha na ukusanyaji wa mapato, hivyo tunaamini hilo ni suala la mchakato na tumewasilisha andiko TAMISEMI ili kuangalia namna ya kuzifanya BMU kuendelea na shughuli zake hata pale ambapo mradi wa SWIOFish utakapokwisha muda wake,"anaongeza Dk. Mlalila.

Akizungumzia suala hilo, Naibu Waziri wa Mifugo na Uvuvi, Pauline Gekul alisema "BMU ya Kata ya Dunda na zingine zikajifunze Pangani kuona wao wanafanyaje na sisi kama Wizara tutaangalia kama kuna chanzo ambacho wataalam wa Halmashauri wanakusanya na hakifanyi vizuri na kuna BMU mahali inakusanya vizuri bani tutabua hivyo hoja tuone tutafanyaje."

"Ukweli ni kwamba kwenye vyanzo hivi vya leseni na ushuru wa rasilimali za uvuvi katika hal-

mashauri zetu nyingi hazifanyi vizuri na hivyo kuna haja ya kuviangalia vizuri hasa wataalam wetu wanaotumika kukusanya hayo mapato kwa sababu kuna baadhi yao wamefanya hapo ndio maeneo yao ya kupatia pesa zao,"anasema Gekul.

Gekul, anasema Wakurugenzi wanaweza kuwa na nia njema kabisa lakini wale wanaotumwa kukusanya hayo mapato wanarudisha maduhuli hayo kama walivyotumwa?

Anasema kama kuna watu wanauwezo wa kukusanya zaidi ya wataalam wa Halmashauri sidhani kama kuna haja ya kuwa na kigugumizi cha kuwatoa hao watu ili kazi hiyo apewe anayeweza kukusanya vizuri. "Kwa sababu mwisho wa siku sisi wananchi tunachotaka ni maendeleo hivyo nisingependa niseme moja kwa moja hapa kuwa BMU wapewe kazi hiyo isipokuwa Halmashauri ziangalie kama sheria inawaruhusu kuwatumia BMU kukusanya mapato,"anaongeza Gekul.

Gekul, anasema kuwa wao kama Wizara watawasiliana na TAMISEMI kuona maelekezo yakoje kwa sababu anasema kuna vyanzo Halmashauri zenye zinakusanya na vingine vinaruhusiwa kukusanywa na wakala na pale ambapo BMU itaonekana inafaa ipewe uwezo wa kukusanya.

Nine people arraigned for stealing cashew nuts

NINE people have been arraigned for allegedly stealing 1,515 sacks of raw cashew nuts worth 163.9m/- from Yalin Cashew Nut Company Store situated in Masjute Industrial Area in Mtwara Region.

Speaking on the incident, Mtwara Regional Police Commander Mruk Njem said the suspects had been arraigned for allegedly breaking into the cashew nut warehouse and stealing the cashew nuts.

The incident occurred between September and October last year, adding that the suspects were later taken to court on December 24 and were charged with stealing 105,725kg.

The RPC named those arraigned as Yusuf Lupalala (40), Issa Chitanda (24), Ally Seleman (27), Faraji Zungu (36), Hariza Bonge (32), Mudy Juba (27), Hassan Ndolorini (36), Abillah Ndiringa (28) and John Nyeri (34). He said the police were still hunting for others in connection with the theft and he warned other people against

BMUs important for development of fisheries sub-sector - Dr Mlalila

THE government has called upon district councils should learn beach management units (BMUs) in their specific areas and use them to enhance revenue collections from fishing activities.

The coordinator of the South West Indian Ocean Fisheries Governance and Shared Growth (SWIOFish) project under the Ministry of Livestock and Fisheries, Dr Nichrous Mlalila, has said the BMUs are important for development of the fishing sub-sector.

He made the statement on Thursday when briefing the Livestock and Fisheries Deputy Minister, Pauline Gekul who was inspecting construction progress of BMU office at Dunda ward in Bagamoyo District, Coast Region with support from the SWIOFish project under the World Bank.

Dr Mlalila was concerned that collected revenues are currently spent by the district councils instead of being returned to the BMUs which are responsible of managing the beach areas as well as ensuring sustainable fishing activities.

He however noted that there are some legal

challenges which prohibit BMUs from collecting revenues from marine resources.

"We encourage district councils to allow BMUs to collect revenues and use them to develop their fishing activities. These revenues will be directly spent to improve the fishing sector," Dr Mlalila noted.

He added that in district where the BMUs have been allowed to collect revenues, collections have increased tremendously.

He gave an example of Pangani District in Tanga Region where collections increased from 36m/- to 256m/- per year.

Under World Bank funded project, fifty BMU groups were established in Pangani, Bagamoyo, Mkinga, Tanga Urban, and Lindi Rural districts and before venturing into the new task of collecting revenues, members of fishery units were trained on how better to do the job.

The task was part of empowering members with financial muscles.

Through the six-year project, construction of BMU offices are in different stages of construction including Mkinga District at Zingibari, Pangani (Kipumbwi), Lindi Rural (Sudi), Bagamoyo (Dun-

da), and Chalinze (Saadani).

The deputy minister urged other BUMs to learn from the Pangani BMU to enhance their revenue collections.

Gekul highlighted the need for district authorities to closely monitor officers in-charge of collecting levies from fishing activities because some of the funds end up in individual pockets.

"BMUs should be tasked to collect revenues, but this should be done on legal agreements. We will consult the President's Office - Regional Administration and Local Government for guidelines," said Gekul.

SWIOFish is the World Bank funded 'South-west Indian Ocean Fisheries Governance and Shared Growth Project' for the Africa region with the aim to improve the management effectiveness of selected priority fisheries at the regional, national and community level.

In Tanzania, the programme is jointly implemented by the Ministry of Livestock and Fisheries, Ministry of Agriculture, Natural Resources, Livestock and Fisheries (Zanzibar) and the Deep Sea Fishing Authority (DSFA) focuses on six priority fish species.
